COVID-19 Guidelines

The Western Piedmont Youth Symphony will be meeting this spring in a limited capacity with strings only. This accomplishes two goals: it eliminates the aerosol spread concerns associated with wind instruments, and it reduces our numbers to what can be managed within recommended guidelines. Here are the parameters we will work inside of this spring:

- String instruments only
- Everyone will be spaced in an individual 6' x 6' block
- Everyone will wear a mask at all times while in the building
- There will be no sharing of equipment, ie, stands, instruments, chairs, etc.
- We will rehearse 5-6:15pm with no break
- Director will wear a mask and use a microphone to prevent possible spread
- Ventilation systems will remain on during rehearsal times to constantly refresh air
- We will still be in the Keiser Community Room on Monday evenings
- Tuition will remain at \$65 per semester (fall and spring)

Payment

Payment is expected at the time of enrollment, but payment plans are available, if needed. Tuition is \$65 per semester. Tuition does not include admission price for guests to hear your performances. Admission to WPYS concerts generally costs \$5 per person, payable at the door, and helps support the WPYS orchestra program.

Participation

Responsibilities as a member of the Western Piedmont Youth Symphony include the expectation that you will attend all rehearsals, perform in one youth symphony concert, and arrive at all of these engagements on time. WPYS members are expected to be respectful to each other, to their music director, and to WPS staff, volunteers, and patrons. Failure to meet expectations could result in dismissal, without refund. We are happy to report this is generally not a problem! We are proud of the accomplishments of so many of our past and current WPYS members.

Volunteering

This spring, there will be several opportunities for students to volunteer at WPS events and concerts. More information will be given about these opportunities later in the semester.

Youth Symphony Concert

The final performance for this Spring is still being determined. We are hoping to plan a live performance with a socially-distanced audience. However, if this is not possible by April, we will plan a virtual event instead. Final details will be given closer to the concert date. **We look forward to having you with us this season!**

David Wortman earned a Bachelor of Music in Music Education, Cum Laude, from Appalachian State University, as well as a Master of Music in Music Education from UNCG. He earned National Board Certification in 2010. Mr. Wortman is Band Director at Northview Middle School in Hickory. As a clinician and adjudicator, Mr. Wortman has been the conductor of numerous honor bands and university summer camp bands. He is in demand as a saxophonist and woodwind doubler with numerous professional jazz ensembles, small groups, and pit orchestras. He is the Past-Chair of the NCMEA Jazz Section. He was voted Catawba County Band Director of the Year in 2014 and the Wilmer Jenkins Teacher of the Year for Northview MS in 2012. Mr. Wortman has served as an adjunct faculty member of Lenoir-Rhyne University, conducting multiple ensembles. He is a member of the American School Band Directors Association (ASBDA) and is a Cannonball Saxophone Endorsed Educator.
